Kids find parents' jobs more than catching bad guys

FORT PIERCE – Some law enforcement personnel will be taking much more than their lunch with them on Thursday.

Their daughters, sons and grandchildren will join them in their commute to work with thousands of people on National Take Our Daughters and Sons To Work® Day. This year, the department is expecting about 25 children to take part in the annual observance.

The children will meet with Chief R. Sean Baldwin, participate in mock traffic stop, tour 911, learn about internet safety, attend a K9 demonstration and process a mock crime scene.

“We have a lot of activities planned for the children, which is the largest we have ever had to participate,” said Audria V. Moore, the department’s spokesperson. “The activities are designed to help our children understand what we do, while they are in school.

Take Our Daughters And Sons To Work Day is more than a career day; it is an opportunity for girls and boys to discuss the competing challenges of work and family, how they are affected by these forces, and how they believe family-friendly workplaces should function. It also strives to change public policy and workplace cultures to ensure that family-friendly environments are the norm rather than the exception.
