Fort Pierce Police Department Receives High Marks at Re-Accreditation Ceremony

On February 3, 2011 the Fort Pierce Police Department received official notification from the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation that all aspects of the department's policies, procedures, management operations and support services have met or exceeded the guidelines necessary for the agency to be re- accredited. The Fort Pierce Police Department had to comply with approximately 225 standards to maintain the accredited status. Many of these standards are critical to life, health and safety issues.

In a ceremony held in Martin County, Chief R. Sean Baldwin accepted the designation and thanked the members of the Fort Pierce Police Department for their commitment to the process and rigorous standards that are necessary to receive the honor. "This accreditation is an example of how committed our employees are to protecting the community we serve. The process is essentially an audit of how we are conducting our business and exhibits the character and strength of our organization".

The Accreditation status is valid for three years and meeting the Commission's standards is part of a voluntary process to maintain the highly prized recognition of law enforcement professional excellence.
